As we enter 2025, I want to wish you and your family a happy new year and take a moment to share some accomplishments my team and I worked to secure for Louisville in the second half of the 118th Congress.

Reflecting on 2024, I'm reminded of how far we've come. Despite Republican infighting and roadblocking, I worked with leaders across the aisle and introduced, passed, and signed into law meaningful legislation that will make a real difference in the lives of Louisvillians — policies that put the needs of working families, veterans, and our kids above all else. While there have been ups and downs along the way, we were still able to make progress, including securing millions of dollars for projects in our district to improve and invest in our community.

Here are a few bright spots: We secured more than \$245 million in federal grant funding to revitalize Louisville neighborhoods, businesses, infrastructure and schools. That's on top of the \$12 million we put directly in the budget for community funded projects here at home, and doesn't count the over \$1.6 million in backpay and benefits our constituent services team recovered that went straight into Louisvillians' pockets.

We also responded to over 90,000 constituent emails and calls, met with over 300 Louisvillians, and listened to you in 17 community town halls. These aren't just stats — these are the calls, emails, conversations, and personal stories that guide my work for you in Congress. A lot of my work this year — from supporting small business owners with disabilities to banning no knock warrants at the federal level — came directly from conversations with Louisvillians.

We're only a few days into the new year, and I can proudly say I saw my first piece of legislation signed into law (just under the wire for my first term!). As part of the Elizabeth Dole Act — a sweeping package of bills to support our veterans — my Isakson-Roe Education Oversight Expansion Act will make sure our vets can get the full education benefits they've earned without getting scammed. This is the kind of good our government can accomplish when we really listen to the American people and work hard to deliver real solutions.

My team and I also worked on a range of international issues, including working toward peace in the Middle East and Ukraine and pushing for the release of Ryan Corbett, an American wrongfully detained by the Taliban whose family is part of our community.

While we have made progress, we have our work cut out for us this year. My team and I remain committed to working on issues that impact all of us, like gun violence, rising grocery and housing costs, and affordable health care — these are big problems that require bold, thoughtful action.

There are also local issues that we can assist people with right now, like passports, veterans benefits, and immigration issues. That's why I'm proud to have a team of some of the most compassionate, dedicated individuals who work around the clock to make sure we're doing all we can to help our community...

I appreciate every opportunity to hear your concerns and get results in Washington — it's the honor of a lifetime to serve you and your family in Congress and get the chance to make meaningful impact in my hometown.

Now that we're in the new year — hello 2025! — I'm excited to continue working for you. That means more town halls, new legislation, and a team of hardworking people in Louisville and in Washington hearing from you about what's working, what isn't, and what's needed next.

I'm looking forward to all that we can accomplish in the new year and beyond!

March 5 — Congressman McGarvey and Congresswoman Bonnie Watson Coleman introduced the Young Adult Tax Credit Act, legislation that creates a universal \$500 monthly payment, indexed to inflation, for all 18 – 24-year-olds in the United States, allowing young adults to access capital earlier in their lives, better afford necessities, or otherwise build their lives and be more integrated into the tax system.
