Apply for Pediatric Cancer Research and Support Funding by Sept. 2

Governor Beshear and the Kentucky Pediatric Cancer Research Trust Fund (KPCRTF) encourage eligible hospitals, nonprofits, research and educational institutions and government agencies to apply for the next round of pediatric cancer research and support grant funding. New Opioid Abatement Funding for Research and Innovation Opens July 1st

The Kentucky Opioid Abatement Advisory Commission (KYOAAC) is opening a funding opportunity to support research that addresses the drug epidemic in Kentucky. The grants are open to any registered entity (for-profit or non-profit) in good standing with the Kentucky Secretary of State, as well as counties, cities and other government or quasi-governmental entities. The online application will be available July 1st, 2025, at <u>https://kyjusticeigx.intelligrants.com</u> and **will close December 20th, 2025**. Proposals will be reviewed by the KYOAAC. Decisions are expected by March/April 2026. This grant opportunity is separate from other opportunities in the areas of Prevention and Treatment/Recovery, which will open this Fall for the 2026/27 Fiscal Year. Nonprofits Eligible for Solarize Louisville

Louisville Metro Government's <u>Mayor's Office of Sustainability</u> (OS) has partnered with the <u>Kentucky Solar Energy Society</u> (KYSES) to launch the 2025 <u>Solarize Louisville</u> program. The program is open to residents, small businesses, nonprofits, places of worship, and other small non-residential properties in Louisville/Jefferson County and surrounding counties. Trash for Cash Program

Trash for Cash is a state program that helps ensure roadways around Louisville are kept clean while raising money for local community-serving non-profits. If you are a 501(c)3 non-profit, the program works with you to find a roadway that needs attention and in return for each mile cleaned, the non-profit will earn \$100. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis. Apply online here to start the process.

The "Love Your Block" mini grants are administered through the Office for Safe and Healthy Neighborhoods. These grants will be distributed directly to Shawnee neighborhood residents, groups, and associated organizations to help transform blighted, abandoned alleys and spaces into vibrant, safer spaces to accommodate community connectedness and dissuade violence. Awarded grants are from \$100 to \$4,000 and can cover projects from lighting vacant lots, to painting murals, or planting a community garden. Projects are to be completed, and all funds spent by **August 31, 2025**.

Louisville Metro Government's Tree Assistance Fund

KY SBIR/STTR Matching Funds Program

KY Innovation offers comprehensive programs to help companies apply for, win and match federal Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) grants and contracts. Kentucky offers two Matching Funds application windows per year. The Spring round is usually open March through April, while the Fall round is usually open September through October. Kentucky Small Business Loan Program

The <u>Small Business Loan Program</u> is designed to help small businesses acquire funding needed to start or grow their small business. A small business must be engaged in manufacturing, agribusiness, or service and technology. Kentucky Small Businesses Can Apply for STEP Grant Funding

Since 2011, the Kentucky Export Initiative (KEI) has provided financial assistance to over 235 Kentucky companies through the State Trade Expansion Program (STEP). The grant is available to reimburse for allowable development expenses for Kentucky small businesses seeking international export assistance. Eligible Kentucky <u>businesses</u> may receive up to \$15,000 in reimbursement grant funding for year 12 of the STEP program. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.
